What is Symbolism?

Symbolism is a style of art, music and poetry. This style suggests ideas through symbols and emphasises the meaning behind the shapes and colours.

Symbolism art is based on personal experience of the Artists, often linked to subjects such as death and dreams.

Most symbolic art provides no explanation which allows the viewer to interpret the paintings in their own way.

The Scream

The Scream is the most famous piece of artwork by Edvard Munch.

Many believe it is symbolising anxiety.

Evard Munch

Edvard Munch (1863-1944) was a Norwegian painter, famous for his symbolistic art, particularly relating to psychological themes. From a young age Munch suffered from ill health and had to cope with the death of his family.

These experiences influenced the themes of his artwork, love, suffering and death. The artwork creates strong emotions to the viewer and aims to take them on a 'journey'.







<u>Symbols</u>

Symbolism art uses some common symbols to create effects to the audience. If you see the following symbols they mean:

> Books = Knowledge and Power Skulls = Death or Warning Purple Silk = Royalty Apples = Sins A Child's toy = Freedom and Innocence
